Do we work on the relationships in our team or just decide that we will just do our tasks and so we don't have to resolve issues? Do we keep working with farmers who don't want change?

Not to say that there are not times to leave, to quit, to stop and to release control. But I sense that for now, God wants us to lean in, to trust Him to help us scale the mountains that seem way too tall. Then He will have the glory!
